Garden of Evidence

The 2009 completion of **Garden of Evidence** by Dennis Oppenheim further enhances Scottsdale's growing world-class public art collection. In one visit to downtown and south Scottsdale, view other celebrated works such as the James Turrell **Skyspace** at SMoCA, **LOVE** by Robert Indiana, Donald Lipski's 3-story tall kaleidoscopic sculpture **The Doors**, and **Windows to the West** by Louise Nevelson.

The Valley is a hotbed of groundbreaking and seminal public art activity and permanent works. A short drive away in downtown Phoenix are exciting landmark artworks by Louise Bourgeois, Tom Otterness, Isaac Zagar, and Janet Echelman. Both Scottsdale and Phoenix have well-established public art programs with countless award winning artworks in a wide range of applications, ranging from artist designed bridges and noise walls to environmental installations and city parks.

Dennis Oppenheim (New York) is an icon of American sculpture, celebrated since the late 1960's for his innovative approach to sculpture, earthworks, body art, video and performance art.

Garden of Evidence is located at the Scottsdale McKellips Service Center, just a short bike ride away from Scottsdale's Indian Bend Wash Recreational Greenbelt Path.

Other artworks along the green belt: Lorna Jordan's **Terraced Cascade**, **Floating World** at Eldorado Aquatics Center, and the soon to be completed environmental water conveyance work by Laura Haddad and Tom Drugan at the Indian Bend Road greenbelt overpass.

Make a day of it and also visit the City of Scottsdale xeriscape demonstration garden, the visitors center at the Water Treatment Campus at McDonald, the Chaparral Dog Park, and the many water reservoir lakes along the wash.
